

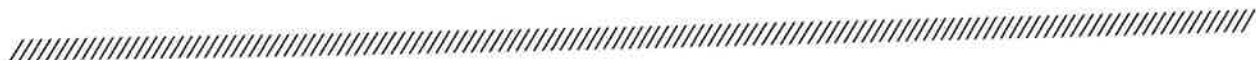

Greetings in the name of Jesus Christ our risen Savior,

In 1 Corinthians 8:6 we hear these words: "...there is one God, the Father, from whom are all things and for whom we exist, and one Lord, Jesus Christ, through whom are all things and through whom we exist."

As Christians it is easy for us to acknowledge that our existence is fully dependent on God. He is our Creator. More than this, He is our Redeemer. Our Salvation is fully dependent on God. He made us and then redeemed us back from sin, death and the devil with the precious, holy, innocent blood of Christ. However, it is a bit harder for us to acknowledge that we exist "*for*" God; that your whole life's purpose is to do God's will and His work in every aspect of your life. But this is exactly what the Scriptures reveal to us. In Ephesians 2:10 it is said this way: "For we are (God's) workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand, that we should walk in them."

In the United States of America there is a deeply internalized sense of rugged individualism – a pull yourself up from your bootstraps mentality. This is a place where people all around the world once came (and still come) in the hopes of making a better life for themselves and for their families. America: land of the free and home of the brave. Where you can come and be your own man or woman.

But this ideology is in direct contrast to what God's Word reveals as the truth of who we are. I am not my own man. 1 Corinthians 6:19-20 reminds us that even what we do with our own bodies is to be done to the honor and glory of God, saying to each one of us, "You are not your own, for you were bought with a price. So glorify God in your body."

Our Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod has defined Christian stewardship in this way: "Christian stewardship is the free and joyous activity of the child of God and God's family, the Church, in managing all of life and life's resources for God's purposes." This definition is broad and all encompassing. It leaves no room for us as owners of anything. It reflects what the Scriptures proclaim. God's Word tells us that everything we have – everything we are – belongs to God. We (as individuals and as His Church) are merely managers of His temporal and eternal blessings.

If we approach all of life with this understanding, how would that change our daily decisions? Would we be more prayerful? Would we be more thoughtful in making decisions? Would we be more generous toward others? Would we be less wasteful? Would we be more gracious? Would we be more forgiving?

As stewards of God's earthly and eternal resources we are accountable to God for all He has put in our care. From our very lives, to our faith in Christ, to the shoes on our feet, all that we have been blessed with is from our Heavenly Father, and is to be used for His purposes. Yes, He created us for a purpose; to use all we have at our disposal to accomplish His good and gracious will. I pray that by the power of the Holy Spirit we would all grow in our true identity as God's stewards to the honor and glory of our Heavenly Father, through Jesus our Savior and Lord. Amen.

A WALK THROUGH THE LITURGY: THE SIGN OF THE CROSS

Encore Post: I began this series on the liturgy by talking about Confession and Absolution as preparation. Today, I am hoping to talk about one action that pastors do over the people: making the sign of the holy cross.

I received a question from one of my confirmation students asking about the sign of the cross, and why “we don’t do it.” I responded, that all Christians are encouraged make the sign of the cross for it is their mark, it was given to you all the way back at your baptism. It is by this sign of the cross that you were and are marked as of one of the redeemed by Christ.

The *Lutheran Service Book* encourages all the baptized to make the sign of the cross at the Invocation and elsewhere throughout the service. There in red, we read, “The sign of the cross may be made by all in remembrance of their Baptism.” The sign of the cross is not just for the pastor to make, but for the whole congregation to do for themselves.

The sign of the cross is the oldest symbol of Christianity. The cross and specifically the crucifix, that is the cross containing the body of Christ, represent clearly that Jesus Christ and him crucified is the object of our faith and worship. There is no other sign more Christian than the cross, and it is a sign for all the baptized to use in worship and devotional life.

Luther in the *Small Catechism* makes that explicitly clear. “In the morning when you get up [in the evening when you go to bed], make the sign of the holy cross and say: In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.” The sign of the cross is not just for Sundays. It’s for every day because every day we are to drown the Old Adam and rise to newness of life. Remembering our Baptism into Christ helps us in that fight. Making the sign of the cross then is a physical action in which our body and our brain are engaged in worship, helping us to further meditate on the gifts given to us by the Lord Jesus Christ.

If you have the desire, make the sign of the cross this Sunday when the hymnal suggests, and may it be an aid to you in your worship and devotional life.

Mites for Missions: Our Cotta Guild supports missions near and far through the collection of our Mites for Missions donations. These mission projects are voted on at our Lutheran Women's Missionary League national and district conventions by the delegates. Thank you for your support of our Mites for Missions' collection on the second Sunday of each month. Your donations may be placed in the mite boxes located at the church entrances. Your donations help share God's Word.

LWML Mite Dollars At Work with the Lutheran Heritage Foundation

Thanks to a generous mission grant from the LWML Minnesota South District to the Lutheran Heritage Foundation (LHF), 6,000 children in Indonesia now have a Bible storybook sharing the Gospel with them.

“Here in the United States, Bible storybooks are highly common. It’s not hard to find a book written in English telling a story from the Old or New Testament at a level our children or grandchildren can understand,” said Rev. Dr. Matthew Heise, LHF executive director. “But in countries like Indonesia, where 88% of the population is Muslim, access to books like these simply does not exist.”

With more than 240 thousand people in Indonesia identifying as Muslim, the mission field is ripe. LHF has been hard at work sharing the Gospel through a unique distribution route - the Indonesian public school system!

“In Indonesia, much of our Christian outreach is beginning with the children,” shared Rev. Ted NaThalang, LHF’s Coordinator of Southeast Asian Translations.

“Because of the laws which allow us to teach about Jesus in the public-school classrooms, we can give students books which they then take home and share with their (predominantly Muslim) families. A Child’s Garden of Bible Stories is the perfect book for this! It’s written at a level that young ages can understand, and serves as an excellent introduction to the core stories of the Bible for parents to read as they help their children with homework.”

With the help of the LWML Minnesota South District, 6,000 copies of A Child’s Garden of Bible Stories have been printed and are being distributed throughout Indonesia. The Indonesian translation of the classic Bible storybook A Child’s Garden of Bible Stories is published by the Lutheran Heritage Foundation, an LCMS recognized service organization that translates and publishes good Lutheran books into more than 150 languages worldwide. This particular publication was printed with the generous support of the LWML Minnesota South District, who voted at their 2022 convention to support the project.

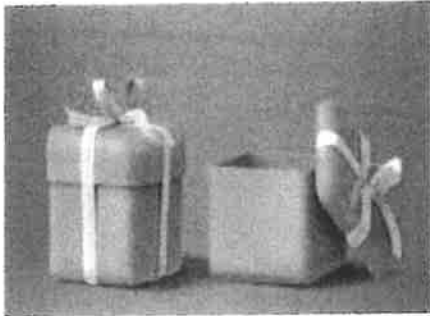
