- ⊕ We believe, teach, and confess in accordance with Holy Scripture that the Lord's Supper is a precious gift from God, in which Christ gives us His true body and blood, in, with, and under the bread and wine, for the forgiveness of our sins and the strengthening of our faith.

For this reason, many are weak and sick among you, and many sleep. 1 Corinthians 11:26-30)

SECOND READING: Romans 10:8b-13

But what does it say?
