From Pastor Lauer August 2021

As I write this, I see that it has been about 90 days since my installation as your pastor (April 25 through July 25). In some ways, it feels like just a few weeks have gone by and in other ways I feel that I've already been settled here for some time. There are some areas where I have accomplished more than I had expected during this time and there are other areas where I haven't been able to do as much as I had hope. Then there are the things that were unexpected.

This is pretty typical in life. We make a plan for the direction we want to go and how we will get there only to find detours and delays and distractions along the way. It can be frustrating as well as exciting to see unfolding the path God has prepared for us. No one planned or could have been ready for the challenges which COVID-19 brought us. A year ago neither you nor I knew that God would bring us together as He did. But this does not mean we should not plan: only that God will most likely alter our plan along the way. To us it may feel like "two steps forward and one step back," but He has always known what would be ahead for us. So the Lord provided what we would need to get through the things that were coming. What we faced may have been frightening and difficult, but our Heavenly Father had already prepared the way.

This principle is demonstrated many times in the Scriptures. God promised the Israelites a land of their own. He delivered them from slavery in Egypt with great signs and wonders. They were afraid for wondering how they would survive in the wilderness. Little did they know that they would see the terrifying presence of God upon Mount Sinai or that God would speak so directly to them through Moses. They didn't know what they would eat or drink in that wilderness or how long they would be out there. But God provided daily for them out in that wilderness for an entire generation! God provided for them as they faced enemies in the Promised Land. God provided judges and prophets and priests and then kings. Those people of God in Old Testament times "lived by faith" because even though they faced difficulties, they still trusted that God would "get them to where they were going." That is, He would ultimately deliver them from sin, death, and condemnation and also freedom from their daily troubles.

This "faith" is demonstrated by Job who, although he faced every conceivable trouble, still confessed "I know that my Redeemer lives! And at the last, he will stand upon the earth. And after my skin has been thus destroyed, yet in my flesh I shall see God!" (Job 19:25-26) It's the same for David who wrote, "Even though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death . . . I will dwell in the house of the Lord forever!" (Psalm 23) These and all the rest did not have faith that God would make their lives comfortable or easy, but that He would provide for them along their journey through life and ultimately deliver them to their eternal destination.

You and I can expect the same thing in our lives and also in the life of our congregation. We make plans and work to complete our plans — as we should — but it is God who ultimately determines our path, our pace, and final destination. Our faith is not that God will give us what we expect or even what we want, but that He will give us what we need until we eventually arrive in His Eternal City — the Kingdom of Heaven. This is our faith and prayer: that the good and gracious will of God will be done among us here in time and there in eternity.

In the meanwhile, we make our plans and carry out our work, day by day, as we should. But we have faith that whatever tomorrow brings, God will prepare us for it and see us through it. He knows the future, our future. Both we and our future are in His most capable hands. We are to work today with what God has given us to do. We are to anticipate what we may need and prepare for whichever way He guides us. He, our Father in Heaven, will determine our path and only He controls our destinations. And we know that He has gone ahead of us and that He is behind us and that He is with us. This is our faith, our trust, in His good, gracious, and loving rule in our lives.

So at this time, it's too soon for me to anticipate what God may have in store for us in the weeks, months, and years ahead. In time, He may show us. But for now, we just keep working at what He has given us to do. But we also know how this story will end: our Lord Jesus is Victorious over all things, He rules over all things, and He fulfills every promise that He has given, even forgiveness for everything and life forever with Him. I'd say that's certainty enough for today.

The Voters' Assembly, at the regular quarterly meeting held on Sunday, July 25°, has voted to **CONTINUE** having worship services only at 9 a.m. each Sunday while praying that the Holy Spirit will draw more to worship until we have no choice but to add additional service times. The radio program will also continue to be broadcast LIVE at the same time each week.

Monday Morning Bible Class will be taking the month of August "Off" and then returning in the Fall at a new day and time when we will review and continue our study of Paul's letter to the Galatians. Everyone is welcome!

Adult Confirmation Instruction: Plans are now being made to offer a series of Adult Confirmation Classes beginning in September to those non-Lutherans who may wish to become members but also to <u>anyone</u> who may wish to review the basics of the Christian faith from an adult perspective. This is not your Jr. High class but an adult presentation of why we need a Savior and the One whom God has given to save us. We will cover the Law (the bad news) and the Gospel (the Good News), Baptism, The Lord's Supper, the Christian life and Christian worship, and what is Promised to Christians in this life and the Life of the world to come. The class is twelve hours and is taught in six 2-hour sessions. It does not cover everything that Lutherans teach, but is a beginning and may lead to membership at St. Paul's for those who accept these teachings. If interested, please contact Pastor Lauer (<u>palauer@gmail.com</u> or 507-304-2402). The day and time for the classes, beginning in September, will be determined according to the needs of those who desire to participate. There are no tests or any requirement other than your attendance. Can't make every session? Participants will be able to view Pastor's presentations from previous years via youtube (but attending in person is preferred).

Jr. Confirmation Instruction: Letters will go out this month to parents of those students we know will be in 6° through 8° grades. Classes are expected to begin on Wednesday, September 8°. If you don't get a letter or want to be sure to get more information, please call or email the church office: 507-835-2647 or stpaulwa@hickorytech.net and we'll be sure to include you!

Small Group Communion which was offered on Wednesday afternoons during the pandemic is now being discontinued as there has lately been very little need. If you are unable to attend worship because of COVID, rehabilitation, or other health reasons, please contact Pastor Lauer for a personal visit. Those who had received shut in visits in the past should expect to hear this month from Pastor Lauer to schedule an initial visit. As always, if you know that you will not be able to attend on a long term basis, Pastor will add you to his monthly list.

From Pastor Paul and Ann Lauer: Thank You! to the Board of Elders and the whole congregation for taking the time and effort last Sunday to recognize the 30th Anniversary of my Ordination. Your kind words, cards, flowers for my wife, and overwhelming support and encouragement have meant a great deal to us, especially as we settle into our new church home. God has indeed blessed us over these three decades and we feel His blessings again as we settle in for the fourth and most likely final decade of my active ministry. "It is good, Lord, to be here!" living, worshipping, and serving together as members of His family. Thank you!

We are still looking for volunteers to teach our kids more about the love and forgiveness of Jesus Christ. Please contact us to get involved in this rewarding ministry.






