I would like to share with you a story of how God taught me how to pray with those who can't respond or when the words don't come easily.

Years ago, I was asked to visit a shut-in, who was in a catatonic state.

So, one day I found myself by her hospital bed wondering how I was to handle this difficult prayer situation. Of course, I began by asking God to heal her - but I felt my pray fell short. It's hard to pray for someone who can't respond. It's hard to pray for someone who doesn't even know if you are in the same room or not. But then God put a thought in my head. I opened the Bible to the book of Luke. I knew Luke was a physician and that it contained details of Jesus various healings. So, I started by skimming over the entire book of Luke until I came to the first healing. In Luke chapter 4, Jesus cast out an unclean spirit "And in the synagogue, there was a man who had the spirit of an unclean demon, and he cried out with a loud voice, "Ha! What have You to do with us, Jesus of Nazareth? Have You come to destroy us? I know who you are—the Holy One of God." But Jesus rebuked him, saying, "Be silent and come out of him!" And when the demon had thrown him down in their midst, he came out of him, having done him no harm. And they were all amazed and said to one another, "What is this word? For with authority and power He commands the unclean spirits, and they come out!" Then, I prayed over the woman, something like this: Lord, many years ago, You healed a man with an unclean spirit. You showed You had authority to heal, when the spirit left the man without hurting him. Lord, please turn Your attention to this woman lying before me. She is an innocent lamb of Yours and she and her family have suffered greatly for 10 years. Like You healed the man in Luke, today, speak Your word and put Your healing hand on her.

Then I went to the next healing verse in Chapter 4 verse 38: "And He arose and left the synagogue and entered Simon's house. Now Simon's mother-in-law was ill with a high fever, and they appealed to Him on her behalf. And He stood over her and rebuked the fever, and it left her, and immediately she rose and began to serve them."

My prayer went something like this: Dear Heavenly father, 2,000 years ago, You, showed mercy to Simon Peter's mother-in-law, when You rebuked her fever. Today, please show mercy on Your innocent child. Please heal her fever, her mind & body. Lord, just say the Word and rebuke the evil that keeps her in bondage. Lord in your mercy.

I continued, claiming God's healing for her, as I read through each of Jesus healings as recorded by St. Luke. These included, the man with leprosy; The paralytic on the roof; A man with a withered hand; The centurion's sick servant; The boy from Nain; The possessed man at Gerasene; Raising Jairus daughter; The woman with flow of blood; The boy with an unclean spirit; The bent over woman; The man with dropsy; The ten Lepers; The blind beggar and Jesus healing the High priest's Servant's ear.

What I found interesting, is that a week after I prayed, her suffering ended and she was taken to be with Jesus. I think her last lesson in life was to teach me how to pray for those who can't. We need to remember even if you don't remember Jesus due to Alzheimer's, dementia or mental impairment, He remembers you!






