# St. Paul, Waseca Newsletter August 2023

Dear friends in Christ,

Last week I got a request from a person who had a problem with violence. He wanted to know if St. Paul Lutheran had a program that taught a person how to deal with violence.

St. Paul does have a program - it is called confirmation. Everything a person needs to know about violence is contained in the first lesson of the Lord's Prayer, the first article of the Apostles Creed and the First Commandment.

You see the real problem is not the violence itself. The real problem is who is the violent person's God. The violent person was not born violent. But somewhere along the way he or she discovered violence as a way to obtain things. They soon discovered the more violent they became the more stuff they received. The problem with violence is that eventually you meet someone with more authority. This person with authority is usually a judge and jury. They have the authority to punish the individual effectively stopping the violent behavior. But this punishment does not stop the behavior. In fact, if the violent person is placed in prison, it becomes a workshop on how to be violent and at the same time learning to escape the punishment.

However, the three confirmation lessons mentioned above deal with violence in a different way. Instead of dealing with violence directly, it deals with it by attacking the root cause. The root cause of violence is not violence itself. The root cause of violence is not knowing who your God is. You see the god of the violent person is found in the sins listed in Galatians 5:19-20:

<sup>19</sup> Now the works of the flesh are evident: sexual immorality, impurity, sensuality, <sup>20</sup> idolatry, sorcery, enmity, strife, jealousy, fits of anger, rivalries, dissensions and divisions.

So as a person goes through life and has, fits of anger, the violence helps the person get their way. This pattern is also valid for the other sins.

But this pattern of violence is broken when the person is introduced to the God of the Old Testament and New Testament. When the person begins to believe in the Trinitarian God of Scriptures the need for violence begins to wane.

The judge and jury can temporary hold back the behavior of the violent person. However, replacing the person's god of sin with the true God of scripture removes the violent person's need to sin.

Notice the judge and jury are external forces while having faith in the true God is an internal force. Thus, having faith in the true God is much more effective in making the behavioral change. The result is the person is motivated not only to not be violent but to replace the violence with loving your neighbor as yourself.

When that happens, the person goes from using the law of violence to using the grace of loving kindness only found in Jesus Christ.







The following article tells of our mighty Mites in Mission in action in Northrup, MN.

And I heard the voice of the Lord saying, "Whom shall I send, and who will go for us?" Then I said, "Here I am! Send me," (Isaiah 6:8).

"I will teach whatever you want me to teach," said inaugural seventh and eighth grade teacher Teresa Kiehl at Martin Luther High School in Northrop, during an interview for the newly formed junior high teaching position, one year ago. God has certainly done mighty things through Teresa and MLHS since that moment in 2022! In April of 2022, St. James Lutheran School in Northrop, MN, found itself without a junior high teacher for the upcoming 2022-23 school year. It was decided, through much conversation and prayer, to shift the junior high grades to the high school campus, both to continue offering excellent Lutheran Christ-centered education to the area seventh and eighth graders, and to be better positioned to bring more students into MLHS. But who would the new teacher be? It would need to be an excellent instructor, someone passionate about teaching but equally passionate about "preparing students for discipleship until Christ's return," which is the mission statement of Martin Luther High School. God answered the prayers of the MLHS administrators with Teresa Kiehl, a 1987 MLHS alumna, who had many years of experience teaching multiple grade levels and subjects and had also earned a master's degree in differentiated instruction from Concordia University in St. Paul. "As an alum, I am looking forward to giving back to Martin Luther and am very excited to be able to help expand the program," said Teresa. "I feel so blessed to have this opportunity." The inaugural year of the new junior high, housed within the walls of Northrop's Martin Lutheran High School, was a success! In the words of Marge Thiesse, Director of Development at MLHS, "The Lord has truly blessed our efforts this year with generous support. Since last fall we have gained two students in junior high. A family enrolled their 8th grade boy in January. He had been homeschooled, as were his siblings. He came home so excited about the atmosphere here that the next day his brother and sister, a sophomore and junior, came for a visit and subsequently enrolled also!" Praise God! The junior high class finished out the year with eleven students. What does this have to do with your mite dollars? Already in this biennium, we have paid \$9,000 of a \$20,000 grant called "Generating a JESUS Generation Student Tuition Aid – Martin Luther High School." This grant provides tuition assistance to families in need, so that financial hardship need never be a hindrance to receiving quality Lutheran education. The exciting part for us is that our mission dollars will have an even broader impact, as more students can be brought into the MLHS community at a younger age/grade level. As Ms. Thiesse shared above, the growth possibilities are truly promising, and we trust the Lord to continue His good work at MLHS. And we know that for those who love God all things work together for good, for those who are called according to his purpose, (Romans 8:28).




