We Praise God for Sustaining Life in and through His Word

The nation resounds with thanksgiving for the earth’s bountiful harvest, crops of wheat and grains, all beneath the canopy of God’s almighty care. But “*man does not live by bread alone, but man lives by every word that comes from the mouth of the LORD*” (Deut. 8:1–10).
