**We Are Humbled and Exalted by the Cross of Christ**

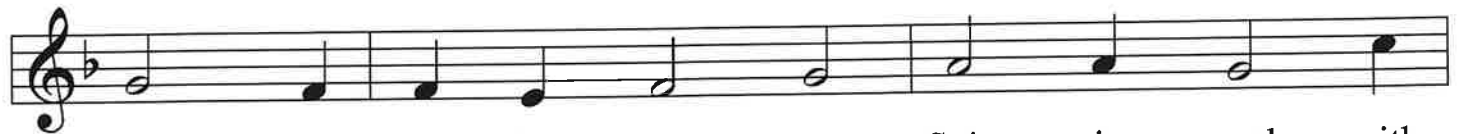
