St. Paul, Waseca Newsletter February 2022

February this year brings us four Sundays of the Epiphany season, finishing on the 27\* with the Transfiguration of Jesus---"his clothing became dazzling white" while Moses and Elijah appeared with him on a mountain top (Luke 9:28-36).

On the one hand, after six years in Hong Kong without snow, this "dazzling" puts me in mind of a snowy Minnesota winter, sometimes so bright that it's hard to look outside. On the other hand, listening to the texts for this Epiphany season puts me in mind of the hard work Jesus was doing for us, and the hard work he gives us to do as his followers. The word "epiphany" has roots in something like a revelation, a discovery. ---discovering Jesus as Gift, to us and through us.

This revealing is something like the TV gameshow thing: pull back the curtain to see the prize. The prize is Jesus, revealed in the Gospel readings as a teacher, preacher, and healer, as one who cared for people deeply, even unto death. And then, as surely as the revealed prize is a car you are supposed to drive off in, do something with the prize: don't condemn people and love your enemies is one way, according to the Gospel readings, that we can "drive off" with the prize, the Gift.

Such hard work, both the work of Jesus and our work following him, have this blessing attached, as Jesus says in the reading from Luke 5. "Don't be afraid: you will catch people."

"Don't be afraid" was the common greeting from angels, especially to those people we met in the Christmas season, e.g., Mary, Zechariah, the shepherds. Now it is Jesus' greeting as he sets us to work--indeed, as our St. Paul mission statement says, as "we joyfully share the Love of Jesus with all people." It is my wish and prayer that as you listen to the Bible readings and sermons of this Epiphany season you will hear that love of Jesus shared with you. It is my wish and prayer as well in this Epiphany season that, as we share in worship and hymns and the work of St. Paul, many will hear and see this love of Jesus.

As God reveals his love in Jesus, may we find peace in our daily lives; and then may our lives be the "hook" that catches people with that love.

#### **Bible Reading Schedule**

This month we read about some of the sacrifices God commanded in the Old Testament. The priests who performed those sacrifices pointed to the Perfect High Priest Who was to come — Jesus Christ. The sacrificial lambs pointed to Christ the Lamb of God Who took away the sins of the world (Leviticus 1:10-13; John 1:29). The shed blood was an "atonement cover" for the sins of God's people which pointed forward to the blood Christ would shed on the cross which would truly cleanse sinners from their sins (Leviticus 1:4; Hebrews 9:11-26; I John 1:7). Blood and water were agents of cleansing from sin in the Old Testament. In water (Baptism) and in blood (the Blood of the Lord's Supper) Christ sinners are still cleansed from sin today (Numbers 19:1-22; Matthew 26:26-29; Acts 8:36-39). May these Scripture readings help you grow in your understanding of Christ's sacrificial death for your salvation.

(Recently seen at Waseca Walmart: drinking cups for \$.10 each, clearance school supplies, toys, and coloring books.)


#### **Operation Christmas Child Update**

Boxes for Rachels hope are placed by the elevator and on the North end of the church thru January. Look for items needed in the bulletin or newsletter.


Judie reported that Quilters will have their Pork Chop dinner on March 6th as a drive thru only.

Next meeting will be February 10<sup>th</sup>, with potluck at noon followed by doing Valentines for Shut ins. Kathy Flogstad/Public Relations




