# St. Paul, Waseca Newsletter August 2022

As a pastor, it is always a joy to visit with people. I appreciate your efforts to welcome me and assist in my transition. Please feel free to stop by the office with ideas, concerns or just to say hi. I believe the church should be a place of healing. The healing I'm referring to comes from:

- 1) Knowing Jesus has healed our relationship with our Creator, God the Father. This is accomplished, when we confess, and He forgives our sins. The only reason we can do this is because of what He accomplished on the cross. Remember He died so we could be forgiven.
- 2) The Lord's Prayer, where Jesus tells us that we are to forgive those who trespass against us. What we will discover is when we forgive, even our enemies, we are healed. This healing which comes from God, occurs in our hearts, I think that is what Paul was referring to when he reminds us of Proverbs 4:23-27 which tells us to "guard our hearts".

Proverbs 4:23-27: Above all else, guard your heart, for everything you do flows from it. Keep your mouth free of perversity; keep corrupt talk far from your lips. Let your eyes look straight ahead; fix your gaze directly before you. Give careful thought to the paths for your feet and be steadfast in all your ways. Do not turn to the right or the left; keep your foot from evil

- A) This healing/guarding of our hearts, comes in many forms. For instance, when we sit in a quiet place and ask God to help us to forgive those who have trespassed against us.
- B) Healing occurs (if we have done something wrong) when we apologize to our enemy for our misbehavior. Remember Christ's words, the exalted will be humbled, and the humbled will be exalted.
- 3) Finally pray for your enemy to be Blessed. This is a final way to receive healing and is found in Matthew 5. Ask God to provide opportunities to show mercy to those you disagree with. Matthew 5:43 You have heard that it was said, 'Love your neighbor's and 'Hate your enemy.'

44 But I tell you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you. 45 That you maybe sons of your Father in heaven. He causes His sun to rise on the evil and the good and sends rain on the righteous and the unrighteous. 46 If you love those who love you, what reward will you get? Do not even tax collectors do the same? 47 And if you greet only your brothers, what are you doing more than others? Do not even Gentiles do the same? 48 Be perfect, therefore, as your heavenly Father is perfect. The world tells us to hate, cancel and destroy our enemy. Jesus tells us to love and pray for our enemy.

So, we Christians have two choices, follow the World, or follow Jesus. I don't know about your but I'm putting my trust in Jesus! Remember He is the one who rose from the grave on Easter Sunday!


